Productive Talk Tools

Help students clarify and share their own thoughts:

- Wait time
- Turn and Talk (Think, Pair, Share; Partner talk)
- Stop & Jot
- Will you share that with the class?
- Say more...?
- So are you saying...?
 - So I think I hear you saying...

Help students orient to the thinking of others:

- Who can repeat what _____ just said?
- Who can say that again?
- Who can put that into their own words?
- Who can restate what just said?
- Can anyone repeat what they heard _____ say?
- After a Turn and Talk: Tell us what your partner said.

Help students deepen their own reasoning:

- Why do you think that?
- What is your evidence?
- How did you get that answer?
- What convinced you that was the right answer?
- Why did you think that strategy would work?
- Where in the text is there support for that claim? (even word problems are text)
- Can you prove that to us?
- Can you explain it to me step by step so I can make sure I understand?

Help students engage with the reasoning of others:

- What do you think about that?
- Do you agree or disagree with _____? Why?
- Who can add on to what he/she just said?

Talk Formats:

Whole Group – Teacher facilitates and guides actively. Focus is on student thinking Small Group – May be used as a time to assist students to reach lesson goals, observe to gather info for whole class discussion, and/or prepare students to speak during whole class discussion
